Dear Loved Ones in Christ,

It is so good to finally be here with you. I am so grateful for the warmth and hospitality with which you have welcomed Linda and me. It is so comforting; it has felt like basking in the sunlight. No sooner have I put these words to paper than Peter's words to Jesus come to mind, "Lord, it is good for us to be here ..." [Matthew 17:4].

At first I smile, pleased by the spontaneous recollection. Then I recall the rest of Peter's words, "if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." Immediately I reconsider the simile of basking in the sunlight. This pericope from Matthew is about the epiphanic transfiguration of Jesus in the presence of Elijah, Moses, and God as witnessed by Peter, James, and John. In the face of this story the pleasure I feel at the fulfillment of your call pales in comparison, yet I find commonality in how we may respond to these different stories.

It is natural to revel and even bask in the significant experiences of our lives. These experiences may feel like moments of having captured light in a bottle. And sometimes as we try to give expression to the moment it may come out like Peter's sleep-deprived or nonsensical response to build booths to honor the moment. But the moment is just that – a passing moment – from which Jesus calls Peter, James, and John to move forward toward the moments that will come. In essence Jesus cautions Peter, James, and John not dwell on the moment; instead he prioritizes ministry by embracing the opportunities that present themselves. Jesus is looking forward.

That said it is important for us to take our rest and – perhaps more importantly – to engage in recreation while we can. Recreation is not purely intended for basking in the moment, rather it is essential for rejuvenation of mind, body, and spirit so that we can engage in acts of imaginative re-creation.

To this end I am embracing the relative quiet of the remainder of this summer season to engage in conversations with leaders, staff, ministry teams, and individuals about hopes, aspirations, and concerns as we reflect upon what it means to be transformed by living out and looking forward through the lens of our mission statement; to Love, Learn and Serve in Christ's name.

I am looking forward to hearing your stories and reflections about St. Michael's and our mission. In the mean time, may you make room amid your basking for imagination and rejuvenation in anticipation of Rally Sunday and the ministry opportunities that will present themselves.
