Dear Loved Ones in Christ,

Before you read further, take a moment to reflect on the following paraphrase of the familiar Eucharistic invitation. The gifts of God are given for the people of God that you might feed on Christ in your heart by faith with thanksgiving.

The proof of God's abundant mercy and charity toward us is seldom obvious; it usually reveals itself in glimpses over time, when we are not looking. It is in the discovery of God's abundance where Jesus aims to take us all by surprise, to awaken us to the abundant and overlooked grace in which we abide: with the Giver who lives at the heart of all life. Each of us can only receive that particular gift with an open heart and empty hands, knowing who the real giver is behind all good gifts.

The natural response to receiving such a generous and unmerited gift is the spontaneous and freewill outpouring of thanksgiving to the Giver. This response finds clear expression in 1 Chronicles 29:14, "But who am I, and what is my people, that we should be able to make this freewill-offering? For all things come from you [O LORD], and of your own have we given you." Here there is recognition of our faults and our dependence upon God's extravagantly abundant grace; and the acknowledgement that what we enjoy in this life is the result of our use of God's abundance, and what we return is God's to begin with.

It is easy to take the familiar – what we are accustomed to – for granted and to focus our attention on whatever happens to be demanding our attention at the moment. What we often don't realize is that these demands distract us by drawing our attention away from the very things that sustain us and toward the things that drain us. Our relationship to "our" possessions, especially money, is often at the top of the list of things that distract us and cause us to turn inward to ourselves, which leads us to turn our backs to our Creator, the Giver and Source of our very lives and all that we value.

This is why David's observation in 1 Chronicles 29:14 is so compelling. He is reminding us of God's sovereignty and what our relationship with God, as the source of all we have, should look like. However, we still are confronted with the realities and practicalities of our lives that constrain us. It is unrealistic to think that we can flip a switch and become grateful givers just because I ask you to. The reality is this is usually a work in progress that will require effort and time. But what we can do immediately is to begin to pray. Begin by spending time with this verse from 1 Chronicles and praying about what the Holy Spirit may be telling you about sharing the gifts God has entrusted to you.

But who am I, and what is my people, that we should be able to make this freewill offering? For all things come from you, and of your own have we given you.

Then join me in praying about how our gifts will enable us not only to thrive but grow in our service to each other and those around us. Our giving does not repay a debt, is not a duty, nor is it a response to a need. Rather it flows forth from our knowledge and experience of the free and extravagant love of Christ. In this way, we begin to move from thinking about the perceived scarcity of our means to knowing the abundance of God's blessing.

PARKING LOT PROJECT UPDATE

Please pardon our dust as the parking lot project is in full steam. As many of you may have noticed, the parking lot project has made some good progress. All of the old asphalt was removed, new catch basins and additional curbs were added for drainage, the gravel base was inspected and replaced as needed. The entire parking lot has been regraded to the new catch basin and two new gravel channels we added in the rear to allow water to drain to the ravine while reducing erosion. All of the old light poles were removed and new concrete bases have been poured. All of the gutter downspouts on the west side of the building have been tied into the storm sewers. The existing rear light poles have been taken down and the concrete bases replaced. The new poles will come with high efficiency LED light fixtures and the existing pole fixtures will be replaced with LED fixtures. During the project all of the wiring from the 1950's will be replaced with new wiring.

The following is scheduled to be complete by Rally Sunday: All base asphalt will be in place, all lights and poles will be installed, a new sidewalk from the front of the church to the memorial garden will be complete (will also provide access to new play ground), a new dumpster pad will be poured and the yard will be repaired. The final top coat of asphalt will not be in place by Rally Sunday, but the parking lot will be striped. The base asphalt is courser than the final layer which should be installed by the end of September. We again want to thank everyone for their patience during the replacement of the parking lot.

We were blessed with a beautiful morning for our annual Morning Prayer Service in the Memorial Garden on August 25th!




