Dear Sisters, Brothers and Others,


We have a great story before us this first Sunday of August. It's the story of Jacob's transformation into Israel after wrestling all night with a man in the wilderness. In this encounter Jacob is filled with fear as he anticipates coming face-to-face with his long estranged brother Esau, whom he cheated out of his inheritance.

I see the wrestling match as a metaphor for Jacob's grappling with his fear as he anticipates a confrontation over the harm he visited upon his brother. In this Jacob imagines the absolute worst - the loss of his life, his family and all he owns. To his credit, Jacob is not overcome by his fear. Though he is injured in the wrestling match, Jacob does not succumb to fear, and in his perseverance he comes to a startling revelation: grappling with your fear can bring you into the presence of God - a place of blessing, not fear. It is because of this difficult and perhaps hurtful encounter Jacob (one who grasps or usurps) is transformed into Israel (one who strives with God).

This story [Genesis 32:22-31] resonates among us as clearly today as it did in its first telling millennia ago. In the month to come, as we perhaps enjoy the waning days of summer vacation, I invite you wrestle with this story a bit, and I pray that you may find "good trouble," transformation, and blessings in the presence of God.

PROJECTS: INSIDE AND OUT!

In 2019, former parishioner, Rick Yocum kindly left monies to the church from his estate. The funds were designated "for beautification projects" as approved by the Aesthetics Committee. Rick and Jacquey's adult children requested that a portion of their gift be used for enhancements of the church grounds. This summer beautification was completed to the exterior landscaping of the front of the church. Beds were redefined and edged, vinca minor ground cover was planted, an existing bush was transplanted, new perennial hydrangea and boxwood plants were added and trees and existing bushes were trimmed up and shaped. In addition, planting areas were composted and mulched.



As worship services are presented now outside, this is a perfect time to take notice of our lovely beautification project with thanks for the Yocum gift.

There have been other enhancements taking place as well. The old nursery room has taken on a new look through wallpaper removal and a fresh coat of paint. The area can now be used as a bride's room or as a general multi-purpose room. The large youth group room has also been painted and looks great. Caroline Miller, soprano



Caroline Miller is an innovative and theatrical singer with a particular interest in contemporary opera, operetta, and film. She appeared with Ohio Light Opera as Phyllis (Iolanthe), Mascha (The Chocolate Soldier), and the dramatic diva Bellabruna (Blossom Time). Ms. Miller appears on the only contemporary professional recording of Blossom Time, produced by Albany Records. Opera News lauded her portrayal of Bellabruna, writing "Miller projects all the confident insouciance of a pampered prima donna." She is a co-founder of The Pleiades Project, which tells women's stories and brings opera to new audiences through film. Ms. Miller starred in the short-film Così, which was named an official selection in the NY Indie Theatre Film Festival. She holds a Masters of Music in Vocal Performance from the Eastman School of Music and a Bachelor of Arts from Washington University in St. Louis.

Mary Cloud, mezzo soprano



Mary Cloud is a mezzo-soprano from Atlanta, Georgia, and is thrilled to join the Toledo Opera as their mezzo-soprano Resident Artist for the 2019-2020 season. Ms. Cloud performed the role of Despina (Così fan tutte) at the Hawai'i Performing Arts Festival and the Metro Detroit Opera Workshop. She also sang the role of the Second Lady (Die Zauberflöte) at the Hawai'i Performing Arts Festival. Also at home in the world of musical theater, Ms. Cloud performed the role of Ladybug in Pasek and Paul's James and the Giant Peach at Tulane Summer Lyric Theater in New Orleans. Ms. Cloud was recently a member of the New Orleans Opera Chorus and performed with the company's Opera on Tap chapter. She holds degrees from Loyola University, New Orleans (MM) and Indiana University, Bloomington (BM).

Jaewook Lee, tenor



Jeawook Lee, tenor and native South Korean, received a BM from Seoul National University and a Diploma and a Master's degree from Southern Methodist University. His operatic roles while at SMU included Don Basilio (Le nozze di Figaro), The Mayor (Albert Herring), Count Belfiore (La finta giardiniera) and Sam Polk (Susannah). He sang the role of Tamino (The Magic Flute) at the Amalfi Coast Music Festival in Naples, Italy, Nemorino in the Dallas Opera's outreach production of The Elixir of Love and Alfredo (La traviata) at Opera in the Ozarks. Mr. Lee was a finalist in 2012 and 2014 at the Dallas Opera Guild Vocal Competition and 2014 at the McCammon Voice Competition and won fourth place at NATS. He just finished his Artist Diploma program at Texas Christian University where he performed the roles of Don José (La tragédie de Carmen), Fenton (Falstaff), Lysander (A Midsummer Night's Dream) and Rinuccio (Gianni Schicchi).

Rahim Mandal, baritone



American baritone Rahim Mandal who is known for his vocal power and charismatic presence, is thrilled to be one of Toledo Opera's Resident Artists for the 2019-2020 season. Recently, Mr. Mandal was seen singing Usciere (Rigoletto) with New Orleans Opera. Other professional engagements include the Big Bad Wolf in Samuel Barber's Little Red Riding Hood with New Orleans' MetroPelican Opera Company's outreach program, Wagner (Faust) with Natchez Music Festival, and Aeneas (Dido and Aeneas) with Teatro Lírico in Havana, Cuba. Mr. Mandal has also been a soloist for many concerts including a benefit concert of Faure's Requiem. Mr. Mandal holds two degrees in vocal performance, a Bachelor's from Loyola University New Orleans and a Masters from Florida State University.

Emily Morin, pianist



Pianist Emily Morin explores her interest in a wide range of solo repertoire and frequently collaborates with vocalists, instrumentalists, and composers. As a participant in the 2018 soundSCAPE Composition and Performance Exchange in Cesena, Italy, she performed as a soloist with a chamber orchestra and in various ensembles. She then returned to soundSCAPE in 2019 as a staff accompanist for the festival's vocal masterclasses, in addition to chamber music performances. Currently based in Toledo, Ohio, Emily enjoys accompanying students in a variety of educational settings and competitions (most recently, the NATS Great Lakes Region Auditions). Emily completed her Master of Music degrees in Piano Performance and Collaborative Piano at Bowling Green State University (BGSU), studying with Dr. Solungga Liu. She also holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music from Providence College, where she studied with Dr. Sang Woo Kang. While at BGSU, she and Nicholas Kottman were awarded first prize in the Dr. Marjorie Conrad Art Song Competition. After joining Toledo Opera as a Resident Artist in 2019, Emily is thrilled to continue with the company for their 2020-2021 season.

Updated Parish Directories are always available. Contact the office to request one. Digital or printed copies are available.




MEMORIAL GARDEN WORKDAYS
