VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

The Vestry of St. Michaels has continued to work hard over the past several months, but since we have had very few opportunities in person to keep you updated, we thought we'd start including a 'Vestry Highlights' section in the monthly Cross Currents.

- <u>Policy for the Protection of Children & Youth from Abuse</u>: The Diocese recommends each parish have an official policy for this. Our vestry formed a sub-committee late spring chaired by Joe Myers, who evaluated a sample policy provided by the diocese. The committee researched questions, resources, and how to implement and execute the policy, and brought their recommendations to Vestry. Their recommendations and the policy were approved and adopted by vestry at our July meeting.
- <u>Code of Regulations (CoR) Revisions</u>: Fr. Foster spent some time in the past year reading our Code of Regulations and making notes to update them to align with our Diocesan Canons. Vestry combed through our CoR and discussed Fr. Foster's proposed changes as well as added and changed some items based on feedback from former vestry members and congregation members. These amended CoR (with a name change to Bylaws) will be presented at the Annual Meeting in January for ratification by the congregation.
- <u>Emergency Preparedness & Threat Assessment</u>: A sub-committee chaired by George Shirk has spent a few months evaluating our building and resources relating to security and safety. At our September meeting, George presented their recommendations to bring our building up to higher safety standards, including more comprehensive signs (AED, labeling doors so it is easier to describe to taxis or emergency responders which door to go to), handrails, tornado and shelter-in-place areas that are accessible to all people in the building, and more. The committee, which included staff who are in the building regularly, left no stone unturned this very thorough assessment and you will start seeing changes and improvements before too long!

I'm grateful to each vestry member for their thoughtful hard work and insights shared at our meetings. Thank you!

WHAT WILL WE DO NOW?

A lot of time has passed since the choir has met in person and I for one miss seeing your faces, hearing your voices, and making music together. Music at St. Michael's in the Hills brings a lot of people together and I am eager to get the proverbial ball rolling again. So how are we going to do this in the time of Covid?

In the spring we experimented with the app called Acapella and it was very helpful but it did have its limitations. One limitation with the Acapella app is that it would only function for IPhone users, which eliminated more than half of the choir. With the app eliminating half of the choir, it put extra pressure on those who did have the app to record a lot of music in a short amount of time.

This time around I want to make the process easier and, hopefully, less stressful for everyone involved. I will be selecting weekly quartets to record one hymn or song. This will hopefully give people a longer break in between recording sessions and reduce the amount of music that a group will work on from 7-9 pieces a week to just 1 a week.

\Rightarrow 50 how do you record a video?



- ⇒ 1st —You will receive an email from me containing a track with your specific voice part and sheet music for that week's song selection. All voice parts will be sent in one email so be sure to find your appropriate voice part.
- $\Rightarrow 2^{nd}$ —You will need two devices. One to record the video of you singing and another device with headphones to play your voice part. For example, I would record myself singing on my Iphone and listen to the track from my Ipad with my headphones. In the track you will hear a countdown before the music starts. Please count down with the recording! This is very important because it will make the editing process a lot easier.
- ⇒ 3rd —You will need to make yourselves familiar with the website https://wetransfer.com/. This site will take large video files and send it to my email address with zero hassle. You can practice by emailing me a video of you telling me about your summer! I would love to hear from you!

We will begin working on music for the middle of October. If you are interested in joining us for the virtual choir please email me at justin@lovelearnserve.org. These pieces will be posted on the St. Michael's in the Hills Facebook and Youtube page after Sunday's service. Additionally, I am looking into setting up a projector and sound system to play one work as a prelude, offertory, or postlude. I look forward to working with everyone again in these socially distant times.

ST. MICHAEL'S MEDAL NOMINATIONS SOUGHT

Each year St. Michael's offers the opportunity for parishioners to nominate individuals for the St. Michael's Medal. Nominations for 2021 are now being accepted until November 13.

By way of background, the awarding of the St. Michael's Medal is the highest honor that St. Michael's in the Hills can bestow. The St. Michael's Medal may be awarded to communicants who have provided years of dedicated and distinguished service to St. Michael's.

The following are the medal candidate eligibility criteria:

- Medal candidates must be communicants in good standing who have performed dedicated and distinguished service to St. Michael's. Examples of dedicated and distinguished service include:
 - Time: At least a decade of service attending to the various needs of the parish;
 - ♦ Talent: Outstanding leadership in the mission of St. Michael's; and
 - ♦ Treasure: Generous financial gifts.
- Medal candidates cannot be serving on Vestry during the year of nomination or the year in which the St. Michael's Medal is awarded.
- Medal candidates cannot have previously received a St. Michael's Medal. (For a list of some previous recipients, see below.)

Nomination forms will be available on a table on Sunday mornings, or you may contact the office and request a form be sent to you in the regular mail or via email. Nominations are due by Noon on November 13, 2020 in the Church Office.

The Vestry will vote on the Medal Committee's recommendation by the end of the year and medals will be awarded at the church's annual meeting in January, 2021.
