
The pandemic has been disruptive, to say the least, to our worship community; yet we have reimagined and recreated ways to worship and gather as a community. Still, I think we can honestly say, we are not yet completely restored to wholeness either individually or as a community. Because this disruption began in this season a year ago, it seems appropriate we should, with intention, resume the journey toward wholeness that was interrupted last year.

Given the emotional and spiritual toll the pandemic has taken upon us, this Lent it seems appropriate to focus on the less tangible but very real voids or holes in our spirits. To this end, as a resource to guide our way, we are using *A Path to Wholeness: A Lenten Companion*.

When I think of wholeness, I can't help but associate it with the "Glory of God"; an association I attribute to Irenaeus, the 2nd Century Bishop of Lyon, who said, "the Glory of God is the human person fully alive." For me, wholeness or being fully alive is to be engaged in the heart-felt seeking of ourselves in the likeness of Christ. Assisting us in this seeking, *A Path to Wholeness* offers daily scriptural reflections on the stumbling blocks and disordered affections that keep us from the wholeness to which we aspire as creatures made in God's image. For our part, we will assist each other in prayer and in regular, albeit remote gathering to share our insights and learning. In the meantime, I remain ...

VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS FROM JANUARY

The Vestry of St. Michael's met at its first meeting for the year on Jan. 6th and elected its officers. As part of the incoming Vestry, Ms. Maureen Latigo was elected as Junior Warden and Mr. Alvin Stephens as Clerk. The Vestry also welcomed its new members: Ms. Donna Wipfli, Mr. Jim Boyer, and Ms. Nancy Lehmann.

Additionally, a discussion was held regarding reconstituting the church committees, with liaisons being assigned accordingly.

A plan for defining the youth ministry job description was put into action, and the committee will be meeting this weekend (Jan. 30/31). The hope is that recruitment starts early spring.

Parish engagement opportunities were explored, including the potential for a parish video for Easter as well as direct communication. If interested in participating, families will be asked to provide a short 10-second celebratory video collated into a longer video posted on the parish website. In 2020, both Fr. Foster Mays and Sarah Schendel participated in a 10-session dialogue series offered through the West Michigan Area Council of Episcopal Churches. Fr. Foster volunteered to lead a group as there were so many people wanting to participate. Both found the "course" profound, challenging, and of great value. Please attend our Virtual Common Grounds on February 21st to hear about Sacred Ground and what each experienced. You will see a sample of the weekly documentary videos incorporated into the course which, along with articles, and two books, made the work challenging, but ultimately rewarding. WMAC formed 8-9 online groups which met every two weeks for discussion of the films and readings assigned. We would love to offer this course at St. Michael's, possibly in the late spring/early summer.

Updated Parish Directories are always available. Contact the office to request one.




How TO: Donate Stock
