VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS FROM MAY

As COVID restrictions start getting lifted, we are transitioning into a time when we can start resuming our church activities and enjoying our connections as one big community — the family of parishioners at St. Michael's in the Hills. The vestry has discussed multiple summertime activities to engage everyone, adults and youngsters, including monthly picnics as well as movie nights. The dates will be sent out soon to all parishioners. Live events, entertainment, and charity work will be integrated into many of the events. For example, the movie nights that are planned will offer an opportunity for purchase of concessions where benefits will be used to support the choir activities.

The vestry has also had a very productive dialogue focused on the youth ministry — a significant component of the most recent mutual ministry review. A milestone has been achieved in that the position has been vetted and a job description developed by a parishioner committee of educators, with the focus being the rekindling, engagement, and support of our youth, whether through activities or otherwise. The job description will be posted soon and open for recruitment. Forwarding the job to acquaintances who could be interested would be very much appreciated as we look for the right person (s) to elevate our youth ministry.

Additionally, the vestry focused on the dumpster relocation process while ensuring aesthetic appeal and environmental service access. Zoning is in progress and the parishioners will be updated with any short-lived driving restrictions near the fellowship hall for safety reasons.

PLANNING TO VISIT THE OFFICE?

We had a new security system installed at the Church a few months ago and wanted to fill you in on some changes/additions. When you stop in during the week, you will notice the front doors are locked. There is a new silver panel on the left side of the brick entryway (see circle on picture below) and a small button at the bottom you can push which will ring the bell and alert the staff in the Office someone is at the door. They have the ability to then speak to you through the intercom, and also unlock the door for you to enter. This adds more security for those who may be working alone in the building. You will also notice that the door will chime when you enter, and this chime can be heard on the other side of the building as well. This is a helpful feature so anyone in the building knows when someone is coming or going.





IN-PERSON WORSHIP GATHERING GUIDELINES

We have happily resumed in-person worship at St. Michael's in the Hills and extend an invitation for all to join us each Sunday at 9 am!

PER THE DIOCESE OF OHIO AND EFFECTIVE SUNDAY, MAY 23, 2021:

These guidelines apply beginning the Day of Pentecost, 2021, to all church activities including worship, pastoral services, governance, formation, mission, outreach, and use of church buildings by outside organizations. Clergy and lay leaders are encouraged to work together using relevant science, appropriate caution, and their best judgment to implement these guidelines as best serves their congregation. Updates to guidelines will likely be issued as the pandemic situation changes.

GENERAL GUTDELTNES:

- All participants (including choir members and musicians) should remain socially distant.
- Wind and brass musicians are permitted, with the expectation that ample distance will be maintained • from communicants, appropriate to the specific instrument.
- The maximum number of people at any event is the number that can comfortably fit in the space while • remaining socially distant.
- Prayer books, hymnals, and bulletins may be used. .
- Communion will be received in one kind only, save for the celebrant. •
- Appropriate distance should be maintained during the passing of the Peace, which will preclude physical ٠ contact other than with household members.
- Pastoral services may resume without previous liturgical restrictions, while observing responsible • caution appropriate to the setting.

OUTDOOR GATHERINGS:

- Masks are not required to be worn, though are encouraged for non-vaccinated teens and adults, per CDC • guidelines.
- Singing by the congregation is allowed. Please continue to sing in quiet voices. Refreshments may be • served in individual portions. Participants may also bring their own food for picnics or other meals and events.

INDOOR GATHERINGS:

- Masks are required of all participants, except while preaching, reading lessons or intercessions, • officiating, or otherwise leading an event, as long as such persons are fully-vaccinated. Note: Fullyvaccinated means two (2) weeks after receiving the second dose of a two-dose vaccine or two weeks after receiving a single dose vaccine.
- Singing by the congregation is allowed. All must wear masks. Please continue to sing in quiet voices. •
- Refreshments may be served in individual portions by a person wearing a mask.
