The Ottawa Hills GSA (Gender and Sexuality Alliance) strives to create a safe and accepting climate for all students, especially those who identify as LGBTQ. The group consists of LGBTQ teens and a number of allies and meets every other week. In addition to these meetings, the group plans events throughout the school year to raise awareness and foster a sense of community among all students. The group recently hosted their second annual community-wide Village Celebration of National Coming Out Day. Speakers will share their coming-out stories and advice on how to be a better ally.

# MUSIC NOTES



The harmonization and descant for the fourth verse of today's sequence hymn was composed by Lance Massey (1948 - 2013). He was organist and choirmaster at St. James' Episcopal Church, Grosse Isle, MI, and before that served episcopal parishes in Texas, as well as the Catholic Cathedral of St. Augustine in Kalamazoo, Michigan. During his tenure in Corpus Christi, Texas, he composed a large body of accompaniments and descants such as the one being sung today. Although unpublished, Lance gifted his collection of these to Dr. Saunders when he was director of music at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Church, Wyandotte, MI. Massey's style incorporates harmonies that are at times striking and unexpected, but always with the Anglican tradition in mind.
