For the musicians, the regular practices and public performances build confidence, strengthen self-discipline and sharpen communication and social skills. After practices, they enjoy a snack and social time together and have really bonded as a group.

Their very first performance was at Sunshine's Christmas Program in 2012. Since then they have performed at Sunday Church services, Good Friday Services, Senior Centers, Preschools, People First Holiday parties, Toledo and Walbridge City Council Board Meetings and Rotary club meetings, just to name a few.
